Optional things to talk/think about after your reading:

- If Abram rescued them, why do you think Melchizedek gave credit to God?
- What blessings have you been given, that is a gift from God?

Optional things to talk/think about after your reading:

- "Righteousness" means "being made right." Talk about how Jesus Christ has made us "right" in the eyes of our Heavenly Father. (Hint - what did Jesus do on the cross)
- Think about a person you know who does not have faith in Jesus as their Savior. Pray for an opportunity to tell them about Jesus.

Prayer: Lord, you blessed Abraham and Sarah with hope that would last forever.

Thank you for sending Jesus, who is our hope and strength. Amen.

Optional things to talk/think about after your reading:

- It was 25 years before God fulfilled his promise to Abraham that he would be the father of many nations. Where do you need patience with God?
- Abraham & Sarah were quick to show mercy and hospitality to strangers. Is there someone in your community that might need your mercy/hospitality. How might you do that?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, you surprised Abraham and Sarah with a baby when they were very old. Continue to surprise me with your grace. Amen.

Optional things to talk/think about after your reading:

- God What did Abraham tell Isaac, when he asked about the lamb for the sacrifice?
- Describe a time when God pulled you out of a seemingly impossible situation.

Prayer: Lord, you provided the sacrifice for Abraham and spared his son Isaac.

Thank you for your sacrifice, which has changed our life forever. Amen.

Optional things to talk/think about after your reading:

- Abraham sent his servant to find a wife for Isaac that shared his values. What values do you think are important for a spouse?
- 2 Corinthians 6:14 talks about the importance of Christians marrying another Christian. Why is that important?

Prayer: Lord, you brought a godly woman in Rebekah to marry Isaac. Lord, bless our homes with godliness, contentment, and trust in you. Amen.
